Established in June 2019 under the vision and leadership of Shri Manohar Lal Khattar, the then Chief Minister of Haryana, Government College for Girls, Sector 52, Gurugram, has quickly grown into a hub of learning and opportunity.

Situated just 1.5 km from Huda City Centre Metro station, the college has excellent connectivity while offering a spacious campus that spreads across 10.5 acres of greenery. With its well-planned infrastructure, modern facilities, and beautiful lawns, the campus provides both a stimulating academic environment and a lively space for co-curricular activities.

More than just a place of study, the college is a nurturing ground for talent and aspirations. Its diverse, energetic atmosphere encourages collaboration, sparks curiosity, and empowers students to explore their full potential.

### **Campus and Facilities**

The college campus is widely appreciated for its serene and welcoming ambience, enriched with lush greenery that creates an inspiring setting for learning. The presence of an organic garden and a botanical garden adds not only to its beauty but also offers students hands-on exposure to sustainable practices.

Alongside its green spaces, the campus is equipped with modern, well-maintained infrastructure that blends academics with holistic growth. Every facility is designed to provide a vibrant environment that supports a holistic approach to student development.

### **Smart Classrooms and Lecture Rooms**

The college classrooms are equipped with modern technology to make teaching and learning more effective and interactive. Facilities such as smart boards, projectors, high-speed internet, and audio-visual aids are available to support classroom teaching. These resources allow teachers to use multimedia presentations, real-time collaboration tools, and digital content, which help improve student engagement and learning outcomes. The use of smart classrooms has proven to be practical and productive in enhancing the overall teaching-learning process.

### **Indoor Games and Multipurpose Hall**

The college has an indoor games and multipurpose hall that is used for a variety of activities. It provides space for indoor games like badminton, chess, and carrom, encouraging both fitness and recreation. The hall is also used for cultural programs, seminars, workshops, and other events, making it an important venue for student activities and campus life.

### **Computer Lab**

The college has a computer lab equipped with multiple systems, internet connectivity, printers, and relevant software to support student learning. The lab is used for coursework,

skill development, and project work, and provides a collaborative environment where students can access digital resources and receive technical assistance.

### **Crèche**

A crèche is a facility that provides childcare services for students, faculty and staff with young children. It offers a safe and nurturing environment where children can engage in educational and recreational activities while their parents attend classes or work. Having a crèche on campus supports parents in balancing their academic or professional responsibility with child care, promoting inclusivity and reducing stress for those with young families.

### **Girls Common Room**

The college has a girls' common room that provides female students with a comfortable space for relaxation, study, and informal interaction. It is equipped with basic amenities and offers a safe environment where students can unwind, collaborate, and participate in small group activities.

### **Library**

The College Library has continued to serve as an essential hub of learning and research during the session 2024-25. Spread across 337.312 sqm with a seating capacity of 200 students, the library provides a serene, well-structured, and fully air-conditioned environment that fosters academic growth. It houses a rich collection of 1,288 books across diverse disciplines, in addition to Braille books, previous years' question papers, and subscriptions to 3 daily newspapers (Dainik Jagran, The Indian Express, Employment News) and 4 leading magazines/journals (Pratiyogita Darpan, Kurukshetra, Chronicle, Yojana). Newspaper and magazine stands have been arranged for easy access, ensuring students and staff can make informed choices. Technological integration remains a strength of the library, which is equipped with 6 computers-five designated for use as an e-library/internet center and one for cataloging and circulation purposes. In addition, the library has one printer and a Xerox machine to meet academic requirements. Library operations are managed through the advanced SOLE 3.0 software, ensuring smooth cataloging, issuing, and returning of books.

The library is open from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., with flexible lunch arrangements to serve students and staff throughout the day. It also subscribes to the National Digital Library of India and is an active member of the NDLI Club, thereby extending its resources beyond the physical space. The smooth functioning of the library is credited to the guidance and efforts of Ms. Sarika Jain (Convener, Library Committee), along with the dedicated support of Mr. Pawan Kumar (Junior Librarian) and Mr. Rajkumar Saini (Library Attendant). The library continues to uphold its role as a cornerstone of the college's academic culture.

### **Special Washroom Facilities**

College has 12 dedicated washrooms along with 1 handicapped washroom on each floor for girl students, equipped with sanitary vending machines and incinerators.

### **Open Gym in the College**

The college has an open gym that provides students with accessible facilities for fitness and recreation. It is equipped with workout machines, free weights, and cardio equipment to support physical activity and overall well-being. The gym encourages students to adopt a healthy lifestyle, de-stress, and stay active alongside their academic commitments.

### **Canteen Facility**

The college canteen serves as a central space where students can eat, socialize, and relax between classes. It offers a variety of affordable and nutritious meals, snacks, and beverages to cater to different tastes and preferences. The canteen provides a comfortable setting that fosters a sense of community on campus. As a student-run initiative, it also promotes teamwork and entrepreneurial skills among students.

### **Dispensary**

The college has a dispensary that provides basic medical services and first aid to students and staff, ensuring healthcare support on campus. It is equipped to manage minor illnesses and emergencies and contributes to maintaining a safe and healthy learning environment. Regular health check-ups and wellness programs are also organized to promote overall well-being.

### **Student Support and Societies/ Cells/ Clubs**

During the academic session 2024-25, various student support cells, clubs, and societies functioned actively, organizing a wide spectrum of extracurricular and extension activities. These initiatives aimed at fostering students' personal, social, and professional growth while creating a dynamic and inclusive campus environment. Regular extracurricular programs and club activities are organized to promote teamwork, innovation, and a sense of belonging within the campus community.

### **Women's Cell**

The Women Cell of the college is a safe and supportive space where students can share their concerns and find guidance. It works to promote gender equality and awareness through interactive sessions, workshops, and campaigns on important issues such as safety, empowerment, and legal rights. Beyond activities, it stands as a source of encouragement, helping students grow with confidence both personally and academically. By fostering inclusivity and mutual respect, the Cell plays an important role in building a campus environment where everyone feels valued and empowered.

### **Record of Events and Activities during the session**

The Women Cell of the college actively organized a series of programs and activities during the session 2024-25 with the objective of creating awareness, empowering students, and promoting gender sensitization.

The session began with a Breast Cancer Awareness Camp (October 2024), followed by a set of online competitions in January 2025 including Quiz, Essay Writing, and PPT Making on Women Empowerment. Extension lectures by distinguished speakers such as Retd. PI Mrs. Mahashweta and DCP Mrs. Usha focused on Gender Sensitization, Sexual Harassment Awareness, and Addressing Violence Against Women.

To encourage cultural participation, activities like Rangoli Competition and Cooking without Fire were held during Lohri & Makar Sankranti celebrations. Students also engaged in Poetry, Poster, and Slogan Writing Competitions addressing issues like Domestic Violence, Women's Rights, and Empowerment.

Further, a Speech Competition in Hindi provided a platform for students to voice their perspectives on women's health, digital contributions, and self-reliance. Awareness lectures on Diet, Hormonal Health, and Myths about Dieting (by Dt. Muskaan Jain) and Empowering Youth through Overcoming Barriers (by Prof. Vijaylakshmi Chauhan) broadened the scope of learning.

The year concluded with the celebration of International Women's Day (8th March 2025) with the theme "For all Women & Girls: Rights, Equality, Empowerment."

Through these diverse activities, the Women Cell successfully fostered awareness, creativity, and empowerment among students, while addressing key issues related to gender equality and women's health.

### **Udaan**

Under this initiative, the college encourages students to work towards financial independence while simultaneously gaining practical exposure and experience. Udaan functions in collaboration with various Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) and partner institutions, offering students avenues for part-time employment, internships, and participation in skill development programs. The primary objective of the program is to bridge the gap between academic learning and professional application, equipping students with essential workplace competencies. Through this initiative, students develop a sense of accountability, enhance their communication and organizational skills, achieve financial stability, and contribute meaningfully to community and social welfare causes.

### **Udaan-Entrepreneurship Cell Activities 2024-25**

During the 2024-25 session, the UDAAN Entrepreneurship Cell at Government College for Girls, Sector-52, Gurugram, undertook a series of initiatives to foster entrepreneurial skills, financial literacy, and professional development among students. The college

established a boutique “डोरी” in collaboration with SLR Metaliks, providing students with hands-on exposure to entrepreneurship and business operations. The cell organized several interactive sessions, including a lecture by Ms. Nilofer Rao on entrepreneurship and interview preparation (01/08/24), and a session by Ms. Alankrita Yadav focusing on entrepreneurship, communication skills, and career readiness (14/08/24). These sessions engaged students through presentations and interactive Q&A, enhancing their understanding of business practices and soft skills.

The Saawan Symphony Fest-2024 (16/08/24) and Diwali-Fest 2024 (24/10/24) were organized under the UDAAN Cell, promoting entrepreneurship, creativity, and teamwork. The Diwali Fest included competitions such as braid-making, nail art, hairstyling, handmade diyas, and decor, with participation from students, staff, and teams from other colleges, fostering a spirit of collaboration and celebration. On International Women’s Day, the cell hosted an inspiring session with entrepreneur Sonia Khurana on “Celebrating Womanhood & Entrepreneurship,” sharing insights on building successful ventures and empowering women in business.

Further, a team of students participated in Startup Mahakumbh 2025 at Bharat Mandapam (05/04/25), a premier national-level event bringing together startups, investors, incubators, and industry leaders. This exposure provided students with insights into innovation, networking, and the dynamics of India’s startup ecosystem. Collectively, the UDAAN Cell’s initiatives during the session significantly contributed to nurturing entrepreneurial thinking, enhancing professional skills, and promoting creativity, collaboration, and financial awareness among students.

### **Manthan**

Manthan is a key initiative aimed at fostering social and emotional learning among college students, with a strong focus on their mental health and overall well-being. Through interactive workshops, counselling sessions, and peer support programs, the cell equips students with essential life skills such as resilience, empathy, and effective stress management. By nurturing a supportive environment, Manthan strives to encourage open dialogue, reduce stigma surrounding mental health issues, and empower students to handle academic, personal, and professional challenges with confidence.

During the 2024-25 session, the Manthan Cell at Government College for Girls, Sector-52, Gurugram, organized regular counselling sessions and workshops to promote mental and emotional well-being among students. Key initiatives included sessions on “Challenges of Academic, Professional and Personal Life” (24/08/24) by Dr. Siloni Verma, “Mobile Addiction and Anxiety” (08/11/24) by Samrasa Foundation, “Dealing with Day-to-Day Anxiety and Stress” (10/01/25) by Ms. Vageesha Rao, and “Mental Health and Stress Management” (08/03/25) by Dr. Siloni Verma. These sessions offered practical strategies, mindfulness techniques, and professional guidance, enabling students to manage stress, build emotional resilience, and cultivate a balanced and positive mindset. Through these

initiatives, the Manthan Cell has fostered a supportive environment, contributing significantly to the mental wellness of the college community.

### **National Service Scheme (NSS)**

The National Service Scheme (NSS) of the college is a vibrant and voluntary platform that seeks to instil in students the spirit of community service, civic responsibility, and nation-building. The unit organizes a wide range of activities including blood donation camps, cleanliness drives, literacy programs, and awareness campaigns on health, hygiene, and environmental conservation.

Through active participation in these programs, students develop leadership qualities, teamwork, empathy, and a strong sense of social accountability. The NSS continues to play a vital role in shaping socially conscious individuals who are committed to contributing positively to society. Its efforts have significantly enhanced the culture of volunteerism and community engagement within the college campus.

### **NSS Activities - Session 2024-25**

During the 2024-25 session, the NSS Cell of Government College for Girls, Sector-52, Gurugram, organized a range of programmes promoting health, environment, patriotism, and community service. Health initiatives included National Organ Donation Day, National De-worming Day, and distribution of Albendazole tablets, while environmental responsibility was fostered through multiple tree plantation drives, including “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam,” with over 300 saplings planted. Civic engagement and patriotism were encouraged via the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign, Independence Day and Republic Day celebrations, and a voter awareness march at the adopted Kanhai Basti. Student well-being and volunteer development were promoted through one-day camps, NSS Day, and International Yoga Day events engaging over 200 participants. A seven-day special NSS camp in March 2025 provided hands-on experience in waste management, plantation, awareness rallies, women empowerment, health sessions, and community outreach. The session also saw recognition at state and national levels, with volunteers Lovely, Shivani Yadav, and Chahak selected for prestigious camps, reflecting the NSS motto, “Not Me, But You,” and reinforcing social responsibility, leadership, and nation-building among students.

### **Eco Club**

The Eco Club of the college is committed to promoting environmental awareness, sustainable practices, and conservation efforts among students. The club actively organizes a range of activities such as workshops, seminars, tree plantation drives, cleanliness campaigns, and awareness programs aimed at fostering a sense of ecological responsibility and environmental stewardship.

In addition to campus-based initiatives, the Eco Club collaborates with local communities, environmental organizations, and government bodies to advocate for eco-friendly practices and policies. These collaborative efforts encourage students to engage in hands-on

environmental action and understand the importance of collective responsibility in protecting natural resources.

The club plays a pivotal role in nurturing an environmentally conscious mindset among students, inspiring them to adopt sustainable lifestyles and contribute meaningfully to environmental preservation within the college and the wider community.

### **Eco Club Activities- Session 2024-25**

During the 2024-25 session, the Eco Club of Government College, Sector-52, Gurugram, undertook numerous initiatives to promote environmental awareness and sustainability among students and staff. Key activities included Paper Bag Day, multiple Tree plantation drives in collaboration with organizations like Sri Sri Ravi Shankar and Sri Sathya Sai Seva, and campaigns such as Plastic-Free Campus and Wrinkles Acche Hain, encouraging eco-friendly practices like reducing plastic use and carbon emissions. The club organized workshops on waste management, developed a botanical garden and organic farming projects, and engaged students in hands-on learning through urban forest development with the VAN Foundation under the “Green Dream” project. Awareness programs, including National Pollution Control Day, and the sustainable fashion event “Style with Purpose”, further reinforced eco-conscious behavior. These initiatives collectively fostered environmental responsibility, practical learning, and sustainable practices within the college community.

### **Cultural Committee**

The Cultural Committee of the college provides significant contribution in fostering artistic expression, cultural diversity, and community participation among students. The committee organizes a wide array of events and activities, including cultural festivals, talent shows, and thematic programs that showcase traditions and art forms from diverse cultural backgrounds.

By providing a platform for students to express their creativity through music, dance, theatre, and visual arts, the committee nurtures talent and encourages collaboration, confidence, and innovation. These activities not only celebrate the rich cultural heritage of our society but also strengthen interpersonal bonds and promote inclusivity within the campus community.

Through its continuous efforts, the Cultural Committee contributes to creating a vibrant and dynamic campus atmosphere, enhancing social harmony and enriching the overall college experience for students.

### **Cultural Activities and Student Achievements**

The college has remained vibrant throughout the academic session with a series of cultural events and competitions that provided students with opportunities to showcase their diverse talents, creativity, and enthusiasm. These activities have played a crucial role in enhancing

students' confidence, teamwork, and cultural appreciation. A brief overview of the major events and achievements is as follows:

During the 2024-25 session, students of Government College, Sector-52, Gurugram, actively participated in a wide range of inter-college, district, state, national, and international events, showcasing their talents in academics, arts, and leadership. Highlights include the Talent Hunt Programme (29 August 2024), Inter-College Competition at Government College Sidhrawali (15-16 October 2024), and the District Youth Mahotsav, where Priya Tiwari won second position in story writing. At the University Youth Festival "Shankhnaad-5" (13-15 November 2024), students excelled in short film and poetry recitation. Other notable achievements include Pinki's participation in the Declamation Contest at Palwal, her recognition with a Certificate of Leadership at the Viksit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue, and participation in the District Youth Parliament. Students also engaged in competitions celebrating National Voters' Day, International Women's Day, and online essay, slogan, and poster-making contests at the state and national levels, earning distinctions such as Priyal Yadav's first position in a state-level slogan writing competition. These participations reflect the college's commitment to nurturing creativity, leadership, and civic awareness among its students.

### **Sports/Yoga Department**

The Sports and Yoga Department of the college is committed to fostering physical fitness, mental well-being, and a spirit of sportsmanship among students. The department offers well-equipped facilities, including expansive playgrounds, indoor arenas, and courts for various sports and recreational activities. Regular sports meets and inter-college competitions are organized to encourage students to showcase their athletic skills and pursue excellence in their chosen disciplines.

Complementing the sports initiatives, the Yoga Department conducts regular sessions, workshops, and awareness programs aimed at promoting mindfulness, emotional balance, and holistic health. Through the integration of yoga and physical education, the department strives to cultivate discipline, resilience, and a healthy lifestyle among students. Together, these initiatives create a vibrant campus environment that upholds the values of fitness, balance, and overall well-being.

During the 2024-25 session, the Yoga Club of Government College for Girls, Sector-52, focused on promoting physical, mental, and spiritual well-being among students. Key activities included sessions on mind-calming yoga techniques (21st September 2024), Om chanting and breathing exercises (26th October 2024), and Yoga Namaskar practice under expert guidance (22nd November 2024). The club also participated in the Suryanamaskar Project organized by Haryana Yog Aayog (12th January-12th February 2025) to promote yoga at a wider level. Additionally, monthly motivation sessions encouraged students to adopt yoga as a daily practice, fostering holistic health and mindfulness throughout the academic year.

### **SC, BC, OBC, and Minority Cell**

The SC, BC, OBC, and Minority Cell of the college plays a vital role in fostering inclusivity, equality, and social justice on campus. The cell is dedicated to supporting students from marginalized communities, including those belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, and Minority groups. It provides a structured platform to address their academic and welfare-related concerns while ensuring equal access to educational opportunities.

The cell facilitates awareness and access to various government-sponsored scholarships, financial aid programs, and other support schemes aimed at promoting the educational advancement and socio-economic empowerment of these students. By nurturing a supportive and equitable environment, the cell contributes to building a campus culture that values diversity, inclusivity, and mutual respect.

### **Scholarships for Students**

The college extends a range of scholarships that offer crucial financial support and recognition to deserving students based on academic excellence, economic background, or achievements in co-curricular and extracurricular fields. These scholarships not only ease the financial burden of education but also motivate students to strive for distinction in both academics and personal development.

The scholarships are funded through various sources, including Central and State Government initiatives, institutional grants, and private endowments. Together, these programs reinforce the institution's commitment to ensuring equitable access to quality education and fostering an inclusive academic environment.

During the academic year 2024-25, the college successfully facilitated several scholarship schemes. A total of 48 students benefitted from the Consolidated Stipend and Free Book Scheme for Scheduled Caste students, while 15 students received assistance under the Post-Matric Scholarship (PMS) Scheme for Backward Class students. These initiatives significantly contributed to reducing dropout rates and enhancing social inclusion by addressing the financial constraints faced by students from underprivileged backgrounds. Under the consolidated scheme, eligible students receive an annual stipend of ₹12,000 and ₹2,000 as a book allowance.

### **Other / Merit-Based Scholarships**

In addition to category-specific schemes, the college also offers scholarships purely on merit to encourage academic excellence and recognize outstanding achievements:

Stipend Scheme for Grandchildren of Freedom Fighters (2010-11), introduced by the Government of Haryana, extends financial assistance to the third-generation descendants

of freedom fighters pursuing higher education in government or non-government colleges. Eligible students receive ₹1,000 per month as a stipend for 12 months and ₹2,000 as a one-time book allowance.

Marriage Scholarship Scheme for Undergraduate Girl Students who have secured at least 60% marks in their 10+2 examination. The scheme carries no income restriction and benefits ten female students per college. Each recipient is awarded a scholarship worth ₹3,000.

Haryana State Meritorious Incentive Scheme (University Examinations) is awarded to three meritorious students from each stream-Arts and Commerce who secure the first, second, and third positions in the annual university examinations are awarded incentives of ₹5,000, ₹3,000, and ₹2,000 respectively. Separate merit lists are prepared for the General and SC categories.

Haryana State Meritorious Incentive Scheme (CBSE Examinations) is awarded to two students (one male and one female) who are recognized annually for securing top positions in the CBSE 10th and 12th examinations. Each is granted an annual incentive by the Government of Haryana.

Merit Scholarship for General University Education (Haryana Education Department) is awarded to students who achieve top ranks in the 10+2 examinations and subsequently enroll in government colleges. The scholarship carries no income restrictions and awards each eligible student ₹3,600.

Post-Matric Scholarship for Students from Lower-Income Groups is to provide financial assistance to students from lower-income households to enable them to continue their education. Scholarships are awarded based on the total annual family income rather than caste. Two income slabs determine eligibility: one for families earning up to ₹12,000 per annum and another for those earning between ₹12,001 and ₹20,000 per annum.

Through these diverse scholarship programs and welfare initiatives, the college remains steadfast in its mission to promote academic excellence, inclusivity, and socio-economic empowerment among all sections of society.

### **Earn While You Learn Scheme**

The Earn While You Learn scheme empowers students to acquire practical work experience alongside their academic pursuits. Implemented under the Government of Haryana, this initiative has been effectively operational in the college for several years, benefiting deserving and meritorious students by engaging them in various academic departments and laboratories.

Under the scheme, students are remunerated at a rate of ₹100 per hour for the work they perform, ensuring that their efforts are duly recognized. The program not only provides financial assistance but also instills in students the values of self-reliance, responsibility, and dignity of labour.

The selection process is completely transparent and merit-based, overseen by a duly constituted committee of senior faculty members. Selection criteria include academic performance and economic background to ensure that assistance reaches genuinely deserving students. During the academic year 2024-25, a total of 24 students received financial support under this scheme, amounting to ₹76,100, granted by the Government of Haryana. The scheme is convened by Mrs. Poonam Jakhar, Associate Professor, Department of Geography.

### **Placement and Entrepreneurship Cell**

The Placement and Entrepreneurship Cell functions with dedication and strategic vision to bridge the gap between academia and industry. It plays a pivotal role in preparing students for professional life by enhancing their employability skills and facilitating meaningful career opportunities. Through meticulous planning and targeted initiatives, the cell guides students in making informed career choices and supports them in securing placements with reputed organizations.

Beyond placements, the cell emphasizes entrepreneurship, innovation, and skill enhancement, thereby empowering students to become self-reliant professionals and job creators. During the session 2024-25, the college received a grant from the Department of Higher Education, Haryana, to support student development initiatives. Several career-oriented programs, workshops, and awareness drives were organized utilizing this grant to strengthen students' professional competencies and readiness for the job market.

### **Passport Scheme**

The Passport Scheme was introduced by the Government of Haryana in 2020-21 to facilitate passport issuance for final-year undergraduate students. The objective of the scheme is to simplify the passport application process and enable students to pursue opportunities abroad for higher education, employment, healthcare, and business purposes.

Under this initiative, the passport application fee of ₹1,500 per student is borne by the state government. The process involves online registration through the official portal (), followed by verification, appointment scheduling, and document submission. After successful police verification, passports are issued to eligible students.

In Government College for Girls, Sector 52, Gurugram, a dedicated committee comprising four members, headed by Nodal Officer Mr. Jitender Yadav, oversees the implementation of the scheme. Till date, approximately 80 passports have been successfully processed and issued to final-year undergraduate students, reflecting the college's commitment to student welfare and global readiness.

### **Arpan**

Arpan is a social welfare initiative by Govt. College, Sec 52, Gurugram, aimed at supporting economically disadvantaged members of the community, including staff and students. The program fosters inclusivity, unity, and a spirit of giving within the

college. Through activities like ghee and clothing distribution for Class IV employees, retirement and wedding gifts for staff, and winter clothing drives for underprivileged students, the initiative fosters a culture of care, gratitude, and inclusivity. The “Wall of Giving,” inaugurated by the Principal, further encourages donations and sharing within the college community, strengthening unity and social responsibility.

### **Legal Literacy Cell**

The Legal Literacy Cell of the college works to make students more aware of their rights and responsibilities as citizens. Through workshops, seminars, and outreach programs, it introduces students to key aspects of the law in a simple and engaging way. Interactive sessions with legal experts give students the confidence to understand and handle legal matters that may affect their daily lives. By spreading awareness and encouraging dialogue, the Cell empowers students with the knowledge to stand up for themselves and contribute positively to society.

### **Waste Management Initiative**

Govt. College for Girls, Sec-52, Gurugram, in collaboration with the Earthcare Foundation and IIPCA, has implemented a comprehensive waste management program aimed at creating a zero-waste campus. The initiative emphasizes waste reduction, segregation, recycling, and composting of green waste while promoting environmental awareness among students, faculty, and staff. Recycling bins for plastic, paper, and organic waste have been strategically placed across the campus, and organic waste is converted into nutrient-rich compost for campus gardens. Since its inception, the program has significantly increased recycling rates, enhanced green waste management, and fostered a culture of sustainability and responsible waste practices within the college community.

### **Digital Presence**

The college maintains a strong and dynamic digital presence, ensuring seamless communication and accessibility of information for students, parents, faculty, and the wider community. Regular updates regarding academic activities, events, notices, and achievements are shared through the college’s official website and social media platforms. This proactive approach to digital engagement fosters transparency, connectivity, and awareness, keeping all stakeholders well-informed about the institution’s ongoing initiatives and accomplishments.

### **Subject Societies**

The Subject Societies of B.A. and B.Com. provide students with lively platforms to explore their academic and extracurricular interests. They organize guest lectures, seminars, debates, and workshops that not only deepen subject knowledge but also build skills beyond the classroom. These societies encourage discussions, practical applications, and networking, giving students a chance to learn in an interactive environment. By fostering curiosity and intellectual engagement, the Subject Societies enrich the academic journey of students and help create a vibrant learning community in the college.
