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ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- 1. A student absent from the college for more than seven consecutive working days without satisfactory explanation is liable to have his/her name removed from the rolls. A student seeking re-admission after such removal should pay the prescribed re-admission fee of Rs. 500.
- 2. The minimum attendance prescribed by the University is 75% of the number of the working days in the academic year.
- 3. A student deputed to participate in matches, tournaments and sports events, NSS events etc. should submit her leave application duly recommended by the concerned incharge for necessary action before the events.

MENTOR-MENTEE SCHEME
